We know that nearly every one of you reading this is planning to be at The Minnesota Quilt Show in St. Cloud June 15 through 17. Here are some things you don't want to miss.

The Sewcial Lounge—Come by yourself or meet your friends in room University A of Best Western Kelly Inn. We have set aside this room for all our conference goers to relax, chat, and sew. Bring your machine so you can finish up a project you started in class. Check for the hours it is open when you get to the show.

Quilt Appraisals—Allison Rainboth, AQS Certified Appraiser of Quilted Textiles, will be available by appointment from Wednesday, June 14 through Saturday, June 17. She will be in the MQ Town Square near the Learning Stage. She works with antique, vintage and newly-made quilts of all styles and genres. She is happy to appraise quilts that are hanging in the show. Appointments can be made by e-mailing Allison at arainboth@gmail.com or calling 920-290-5198.

Get Your Scissors Sharpened—Gather up your dull scissors, put them in a sturdy box and bring them to the show. Edge Sharpening will have a mobile scissors sharpening van parked in the rear of the vendor area. We expect they will be pretty busy getting us all sharpened up.

Phone Tour—Do you want to learn more about what inspired a particular quilt? We are offering a special service where you can use your cell phone to access recorded messages about a particular quilt. Look for the bright yellow signs for how to listen to the messages. You may want to bring along some ear buds so you can listen hands-free.

Quilt Walk—Will you be at the show on Tuesday, June 13 at 5 p.m.? If so, you are invited to participate in our Quilt Walk. We will assemble in the lobby of the Best Western Kelly Inn. Bring a quilt of your choice. From there we will parade through downtown St. Cloud with our quilts and signs promoting The Minnesota Quilt Show. Afterward we will gather at a local restaurant for supper. All are welcome and encouraged to join us.

See and Sew—On Saturday bring your beginner friends and young future quilters. Gather by the Learning Stage to try new techniques, do a make-and-take project and try your hand at sewing on a hand crank sewing machine from the last century.

Prepping for The Minnesota Quilt Show

As you can imagine, a lot of details are involved in putting together The Minnesota Quilt Show! Thanks to our Show Committee, Show Coordinators, Office Manager Debra Svedberg, Bookkeeper Amy Fennwald, and the Board of Directors for all they do.

Some recently completed or in-progress activities are:

- Board member Reo Pratt constructed a quilt rack on wheels which will make it easier to get all the quilts from points A to B to C.
- We ordered lots of paper and created a schedule for using the copier for all our printing needs.
- We acquired quilt insurance.
- Look for the digital ad we created; it will be along I-94 at the Clearwater exit from May 22 through June 18.
- We created a classroom equipment checklist.
- Gallery cards are printed for the quilt exhibits.
- The show floor layout has been designed.
- Signage with MQ's new logo and show name has been ordered.
- Vendor paperwork is completed.
- Shirts with MQ's new logo have arrived.
- Ribbons are prepped and organized. See the Youth ribbon here.
- The Show Guide layout was reworked and printed.
- QR codes are created.
- Raffle tickets have been ordered and the raffle baskets are organized.
- Quilt Auction volunteers are photographing donations and uploading them to the online auction site.
- Exhibit committees mailed entrant letters about quilt delivery and pick up.
- Signage, volunteer and equipment lists have been created and double-checked.
- The temporary storage locker is rented and is filling with show-related items.
- New merchandise items are entered into our cash register system and volunteer training is complete.



If you know people on the show committee, ask them what they are up to and thank them! Consider shadowing a committee you are interested in during the show, and then be ready to sign up to join the show committee for 2024.

Are your quilts all finished and ready to send or deliver to the MQ office for The Minnesota Quilt Show? Have you documented your quilt by attaching a cloth label to the back with your name and the quilt title? The label may contain additional information if you want, such as the year the quilt was completed, the design source, your contact information, and/or the name of anyone else who worked on the quilt, but be sure it contains your name. If you have questions about any of the information in the entrant letter you received, e-mail us at judged@mnquilt.org.

Please note these important dates:

If you are shipping your quilt to the MQ office, it must arrive between May 30 and June 2. Remember to include a prepaid return shipping label if you want your quilt shipped back to you after the show.

If you are delivering your quilt to the MQ office, it may be dropped off from May 30 to June 2 between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

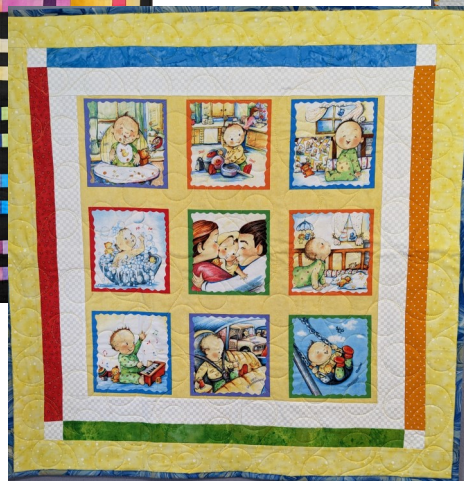
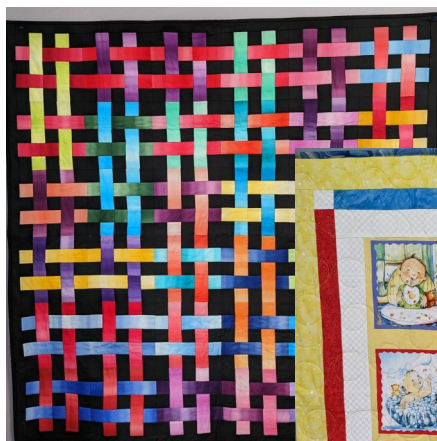

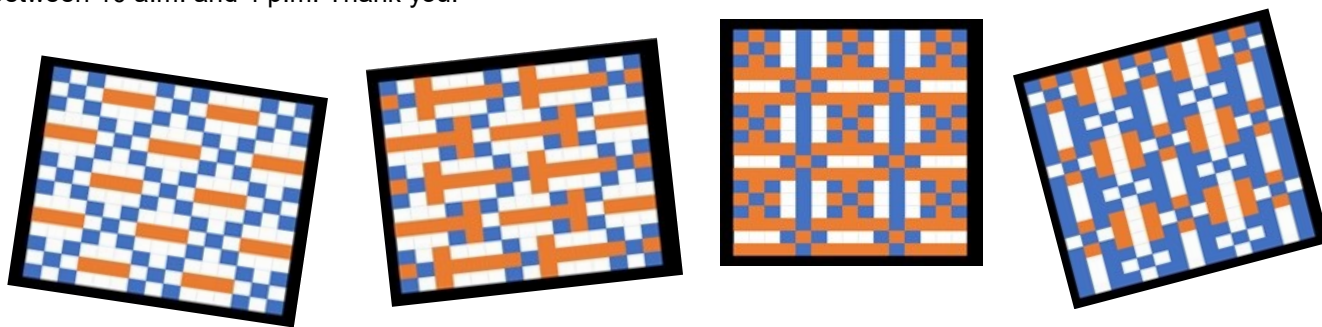
MQ President's Invitational Quilts

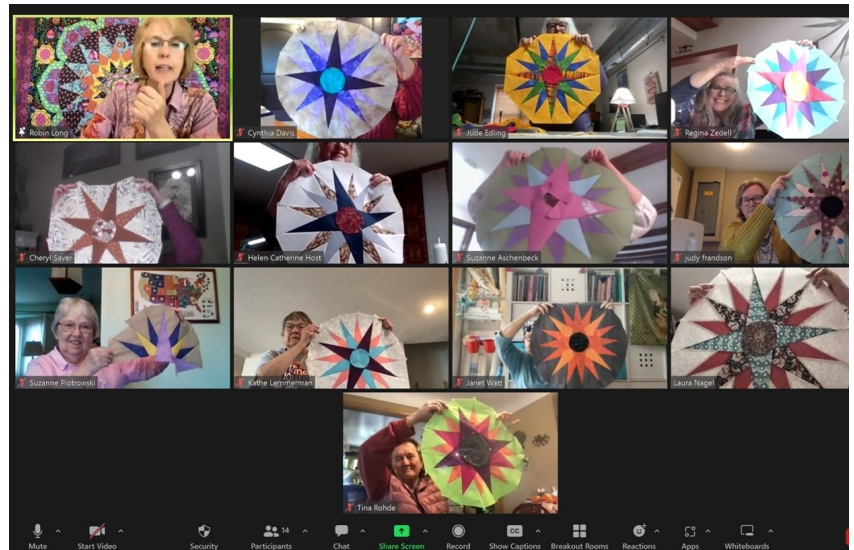
