#### July Meetings—Meg Cox, Quilt Journalist Tells All

Join MQ's Thursday evening Zoom for a lecture by Meg Cox. On Saturday she presents a different lecture on Zoom, but quilters who attend in person will enjoy a picnic/potluck following the meeting.

Join us for fun, food and fellowship following the Saturday meeting. Bring a dish to share. The potluck will be held immediately after the meeting. We are planning it indoors, because who wants to drag tables outside?

Meg Cox is an Ohio native who has been earning her living as a writer since graduating from Northwestern University in 1975. She was hired as a staff writer by the Wall Street Journal in 1977 at age 24 and worked at the WSJ in Chicago and New York for 17 years.

While at the Journal, Meg contributed hundreds of front-page stories and was lauded for her feature writing. Her beats included financial futures, agriculture, the business of the arts and publishing. Since the birth of her son, Max, in 1994, Meg has written for many national magazines, lectured and taught all over the country and authored five books. She continues to contribute weekend arts features to the Wall Street Journal.

Her expertise on quilting stems partly from the 25 years that she has been a passionate quilter. Additionally, Meg served on the board of the national nonprofit Quilt Alliance for 10 years and was its president for six years. She writes a popular free monthly e-newsletter called Quilt Journalist Tells All.





Popular with quilt guilds, this lecture takes audiences behind the scenes of the \$3.6 billion quilt market. Meg spent five years researching and writing her popular resource guide, The Quilter's Catalog, and has written for most of the major quilt magazines. She shares it all, from scoops on all the movers and shakers and latest trends, to rising stars and industry feuds. Quilters are astonished at how much they learn, and this talk is constantly updated with new material. It includes a show and tell segment.

#### Saturday at 10 a.m. Behind the Scenes at the Greatest Quilt Museum in the World

Let Meg Cox, who serves on the board of advisors for the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln, Nebraska, open the vaults and reveal the treasures of this astounding place. Her PowerPoint lecture will show you masterpiece quilts, introduce you to curators and break down the steps in mounting an exhibition. IQM boasts a broad and unique collection of American quilts, including the red and white quilts that dazzled the quilt world when hung in Manhattan's Park Avenue Armory in 2011. But it has also collected quilts from more than 55 countries. Meg created this presentation to benefit the museum she loves, so she charges less than normal for this talk and donates every penny to the IQM. To make it even more fun, the museum will donate a fun door prize from its museum store to our guild.



August 3 and 5, 2023 — The work of Helen Kelley, a founding member of Minnesota Quilters and a Quilting Hall of Fame Inductee, will be featured at two different programs for the August meetings. Thursday's program will be a retrospective of her work displayed in this year's special exhibit at the show, and Saturday her daughter, Jo Lee, will present a trunk show of her quilts.
