


Susan Stein presents 'Sampler Adventures' This presentation and trunk show includes over two dozen quilts that show these old favorites going from predictable traditional to innovative contemporary. New settings will illustrate the endless possibilities for showing off block designs as well as surface design techniques, memories, themes, fabric collections, and more.

Susan is one of the charter members of Minnesota Quilters, having been active in MQ from the very start. Like many other quilters Susan started quilting in 1977, shortly after the bicentennial saw a renewed interest in the craft.

Around that time Susan joined a quilting bee at the YWCA in St Paul, which evolved into the Minnesota Quilters. She served on the MQ Board







of textile design, including fabric dying, fabric painting, thread painting, embellishment and surface design.

Susan has written six books and contributed to numerous others. She has taught many classes locally and out of state; was awarded the Spun Gold Award from Textile Center in 2011; and has made hun-



dreds of quilts, wall hangings, and garments for publication, store samples, public buildings, and personal use. Currently her interests are mixed media art quilts and all kinds of surface design - painting, printing, discharging color, layering, adding digital elements, and writing on fabric.

Walking by the Minnesota Quilt Project booth at the MQ show this year, you may have noticed a display of familiar quilts. Hanging in the booth were a few of nearly thirty quilts in the MQ collection including the Winter Carnival quilt made to raffle at the first MQ show in St. Paul in 1979. In addition to the quilt display, the booth offered information about the Quilt Index database of documented quilts and about quilt care. Many folks found treasures to purchase in the sale of donated vintage quilts, tops, blocks, fabrics, and other quilt related items. Around \$3000 was raised to be used by MQ of outreach and education.

Among the special visitors was Lyda DeHaven from Luck, WI. She is a founding member of MQ and had the MQ membership number 1! She still carries her membership card in her purse.

BEST OF SHOW—LARGE QUILT


"SUPRASPINATUS'S SWAN SONG" BY MARGARET SOLOMON GUNN

Named for the rotator cuff tendon that nearly ended my quilting career, this quilt pairs bold fussy-cut prints with silks. The mandalas were cut and prepped prior to my 2022 surgery, and appliqued together as the recovery progressed. The quilting is all hand-guided on a longarm. Margaret also won 1st place for Applique—Large category (77" x 77")

BEST OF SHOW—WALL QUILT "SOLITUDE" BY JUDITH PHELPS





M.A. The Beginnings Part 111 by Sharon Bobgan

On September 9, 1977, as a result of the interest in further meetings expressed at the spring Quilting Bee, about a dozen quiltmakers met at the St. Paul YWCA. Elaine Jones was the YW staff contact, and the group became known as the Quilt Studio. The plan was to meet monthly on the second Friday of the month. Programs were decided on as needed from within the group, and participants brought their work for Show and Tell, and sometimes for assistance. The membership list of the Quilters Studio named the following: Gina Schuchman, Helen Meehan, Sue Stein, Tom Horning, Marilyn Shimek, Carol Adleman, Lyda DeHaven, Pat Cox, Carol Laitala, Sheila Lee, Ann Degen, Freeda Anderson, Elaine Strese, Kathy Hyatt, Joan Schugel, Bonnie Ellis, Trudy Finden, Norma Ahlquist, Helen Kelley, Agnes Leer, Deede Ballin, Jeannie Spears, Jenny Finden, Kay Bailey, Nell Bredeson, Lindy Westgard and Elaine Carlson.

Although the group continued to meet and to discuss plans for a major quilt show, there was some dissatisfaction with the YWCA as a meeting place. In order to meet at the YW, members of the Quilters Studio were required to become St. Paul YWCA members, and some felt that any dues should be going to their own quilt group. In addition, parking was extremely difficult. As the time of YW membership renewals approached, a decision was made to consider breaking ties with the St. Paul YWCA Women's Center.

A meeting was scheduled at Norma Ahlquist's home for April 14, 1978, at 10.00 a.m. with Helen Kelley serving as acting chairperson. The following people were present around a long table in Norma's sunroom: Carol Adleman - Coon Rapids, Norma Ahlquist - Minneapolis, Kay Bailey - Maple Plain, Sharon Bobgan - New Hope, Nell Bredeson - Stillwater, Pat Cox - Edina, Ann Degen - Bloomington, Lyda DeHaven -Forest Lake, Bonnie Ellis, Trudy Finden and Helen Kelley - all of Minneapolis, Shirley Krantz - Princeton, Agnes Leer-Apple Valley, Helen Meehan - Lake Elmo, Marcella Ryan - Brooklyn Park, Marilyn Shimek - Blaine, and Jeannie Spears and Sue Stein of St. Paul. Merle Harlan, Associate Director of the St. Paul, YWCA was also present.

After a lengthy discussion of concerns, the decision was reached to break away from the St. Paul YWCA and form an independent group. Merle Harlan was thanked for attending and she extended good wishes for the success of the group and departed.

In this third installment of a four-part history of Minnesota Quilters, founding member Sharon Bobgan describes meeting of quilters in the wider Twin Cities area leading up to the formation of MQ. It was first published in the December 1981 newsletter.
