

- ▲ Dianne Conner's hand embroidered Flowers Garden Quilt pattern from Ruby Short McKim Patterns. Finished size is \$45.5" x 45.5".
- ▲ Laura Nagel's Christmas Table Runner is a pattern from <u>Sandy Gervais of Pieces</u> <u>From My Heart called "Overload"</u>
- Faye Bodenhamer made a <u>Strip and Twist pattern by GE Designs</u>. It measures 76" x 98" and was made mostly from Faye's stash of civil war fabrics. It's going to her great niece for a wedding shower gift. Faye said it was fun to make and she may make a lap size for herself.



Both of these quilts were brought by Laura Nagel.

▲ The double wedding ring is an antique quilt she bought in the 80's in Colorado. She bought it from a woman that talked about the original maker. (Sorry, no name) The maker made and sold quilts to pay for shoes for her children!

■ Jeanne LaMoore made the Drunkard's Path. The quilt was hand pieced and partially hand quilted by Patty Nelsen for her son Gregory. Patty died 9/4/2023 with the quilt unfinished. Her daughter, Teresa, is Jeanne's friend and asked her advice. She finished quilting (by longarm at Rose Allen) and added the binding and label. 82" x 96".

▼ Rebecca Anderson made 2 dignity quilts.

A while back we posted a request from the Chaplain, Tom Waknitz, of Walker Methodist (612-695-3652) to have some more dignity quilts because between 20 facilities they were sharing one dignity quilt, driving it from one facility to another when a resident died. Rebecca has made the 2 pictured here.

A dignity quilt is used at a nursing home to cover the deceased as they are removed from the nursing home. Otherwise the resident would be wheeled on a gurney in a Medical Examiner's body bag.

Rebecca says: "The idea touched my heart and I started working on the idea of Dignity Quilts. My research showed that the size of 50ish by 90 inches is standard. I used my 6 1/2" squares of fabric that I had on hand to make a couple. Since I am a pattern designer, I made a pattern for myself. I'm happy to share my pattern with anyone who'd like to make some."






MQ programs in March were spendid!

Sponsored by the Minnesota Quilt Project, the March meetings and workshop featured Linzee McCray and a glimpse into the world of feed sacks. After the invention of the sewing machine in the mid-nineteenth century, sewn cloth sacks replaced wooden barrels for storage and transport of animal feed and human staples. Cotton was abundant as a result of slave labor; mills churned out cotton fabric for all types of sacks. Manufacturers quickly realized that attractive printed labels could boost sales of sacked goods, leading to decades of innovative designs for printed sacks that lasted to the mid-twentieth century. In this uniquely American phenomenon, sacks were used to create household items, clothing and of course, quilts. Linzee shared details of feed sack history gleaned from her research in museum collections and from collectors to write her book "Feed Sacks: The Colourful History of a Frugal Fabric." The Saturday audience learned how to



identify a feed sack, enjoyed seeing examples of feed sacks and items made from them, and purchased Linzee's Moda fabric designs featuring feed sack motifs.

Following up on the observation that frugal quilters of the feed sack era embraced string piecing to use up scraps, Linzee led a "String Piecing" workshop on Saturday afternoon. She brought several vintage string-pieced quilts from her collection. Students worked on projects using her "Signs of String" pattern (Jan Tharp, below left) or were inspired to begin a project based on one of the vintage examples (below right, by intrepid Quilter of the Year, Sharyn Resvick).







Non-judged Information

The non-judged committee is delighted to partner with a handful of Minnesota quilt shops to offer convenient a location for you to drop off/pick up your quilt(s) for the 2025 Show. Locations this year include Quilter's Haven (Rosemount), Gruber's Quilt Shop (Waite Park), Tiny Apple Fabric & Craft (Anoka), Pine Needles Quilt & Sew (Rochester), and all three Sew with Me locations (Coon Rapids, Duluth, Lake Elmo). Additionally, you can drop off your quilt(s) at the MQ office (253 State St., St. Paul) and at the show (River's Edge Convention Center, at the Volunteer Desk Monday, June 16, 11 am to 4 pm). If you are wondering why some shops were not selected, the info below about how and when quilts are picked up is related to the number of volunteers willing to drive to and from quilt shops and the MQ office. Here's the process for 2025.

First, we consider geography and distance to spread out the locations. We contact individual shops asking if they want to serve as drop off/pick-up locations for MQ. The non-judged committee fully briefs the selected shops, explaining what is involved and critical dates. The info is included on the Quilt Registration.


Once registration closes, your quilt information in stored in the *magic* Cvent app and transferred to our MQ show spreadsheets. The mention of Cvent means there are several volunteers working in the background. We discourage quilters from changing drop-off locations, as a lot of after-the-fact notification and coordination needs to take place and errors may inevitably happen.

Drop off at shops this year is June 3rd - 7th, or drop off at the MQ office, June 3rd - 6th (MQ office is not open Saturdays). Before you drop off your quilt, your registration and your quilt information is in the hands of your chosen shop. We send detailed spreadsheets to each participating shop so the shop can allocate space to safely store your quilt(s) along with the others they will be receiving. Monday, June 9th, volunteer teams retrieve quilts at the shops and bring them to the MQ office for safe storage and transport to the show.

Prefer to drop your quilt at the show? Please select that option when you register. We create a spreadsheet specifically for show drop-off. All this ensures we know where your quilt(s) are at any moment, and how everyone's quilt will be arriving at the show. Want to get involved? You can volunteer to participate in the quilt pick-ups from quilt shops or for drop-offs at the Quilt Show.

In the past, many of you have preferred to take your quilt home with you at the end of the show. Please select this option during the registration process. We are looking for volunteers to help us take down quilts at the conclusion of the show. This is another PERFECT volunteer opportunity.

After take down, the remaining quilts get transported back to MQ. Monday June 23 is treated as a rest day for the Show Committee with MQ offices closed. Tuesday, June 24, begins with quilt pick up for quilters and distribution to quilt shops. The committee will be at MQ to prepare for pick-ups at MQ and will return quilts to their designated shops. Volunteers needed! We do not want to be in the place where the question is "Where is my Quilt?"
